

CONDITIONS FOR TAKING THE EXAM FROM MEDICAL CHEMISTRY

**1st and 2nd year, Summer semester, 2020/2021
(Study branch – General Medicine and Dentistry)**

The examination from Medical Chemistry consists of a **written** and an **oral part**. The **written test** is taken in the MOODLE system and consists of **2 parts: A and B**. Part A contains 35 multiple choice questions and the maximum time for its completion is **25 minutes**. Part B consists of 5 calculations and the maximum time for its completion is **20 minutes**. The student will be allowed to proceed to the part B only if he/she obtains at least **70%** of possible points **from the part A**. Subsequently he/she will be allowed to pass to the oral part of the exam only after getting a minimum of **60% of points from the part B**. At the same time he/she must completely solve **2 calculations** without losing any points.

These conditions apply to all examination terms – the regular term and retake exams (the written part is repeated at each term).

The oral part of the exam will take place on the day of the written test (or, depending on the situation, the next morning) in the form of a video meeting in the MS Teams application, to which the student will be invited individually by the examiner after fulfilling the requirements mentioned above. The student will choose two questions, which he will answer without a written preparation.

The time of the exam (test) will be given in the AIS2 system for each exam term.

- Students can **sign up for the examination only through the AIS2 system. The system AIS2 will close the term 1 day before the day of the exam (at 8:30 o'clock)**. This also applies in case of a change of the exam term.
- The examination can be taken maximally **three times**: the regular term, 1st retake term and 2nd retake term. If the student transfers the chemistry course to the second year of the study, he/she has only the regular term and the 1st retake term.
- According to the study rules (article 23, point 12) - **active participation in seminars** (during the presence as well as distance education) **is a condition for taking the exam. Participation in the seminars means not only the presence at the seminars but also reaching a minimum of 50% of all the possible points from the weekly tests and submitting elaborated protocols and worksheets.** This means that **if the student does not meet the conditions for acceptance of practical education and his name will figure in the list of students for a certain exam term, this will be considered as cheating and the responsible Institute representatives will take an adequate action.**
